Course Description

Welcome to World Studies! This is a survey course of world history, starting with a brief review of world religions and social studies skills and moving onward from Medieval Times through the 1990s. Students will be provided with practical knowledge and learn what it means to think historically and apply all information in a global context. Students will apply material learned through exercises in critical thinking, group/individual activities, and experiences in effective writing techniques that will form students into responsible citizens and give them skills that can be used for the rest of their lives. You will be challenged to understand historical events, but also to put yourself in the place of the people who lived in the past and think about different ways of thinking, different ways of viewing the world, and different ways of living. You are responsible for learning specific historical content and for making your own connections to historical periods and world regions.

Excused Absences and Make-up Work

If we go over the activity before the three days is up, you will have to come to tutoring to complete a make up activity.

Respect

- -If you become verbally disrespectful or aggressive towards another person, you will automatically be removed from the classroom and taken to discipline.
- -Swearing is not allowed! If you swear, you must come to class the next day with a 1 page apology letter.
- -Disrupting class is disrespectful and if it becomes a habit, will result in disciplinary action.
- -Do not write on the desks. If you do, you will clean all the desks in the room.

Participation

Everyone will receive 100 participation points per quarter for coming to class prepared and ready to actively participate in class discussion.

Tardy Policy

You are expected to be in your seat when the bell rings. Frequent tardiness will lead to disciplinary action from the attendance office.

Uniform Policy

You must wear the proper uniform and your ID to class every day. The proper uniform means that you are wearing a white or gray shirt and black pants or Hubbard clothing. You are not allowed to wear anything over the white/gray shirt or any colored layers under the shirt. If you are not wearing the proper uniform, you will be sent to discipline to get a rental uniform.
